DEVELOPING POSITIVE CLIMATE CHANGE

We are hearing much today about "global warming" and the issues surrounding this debate. It seems that we are reading and/or hearing about this issue on a daily basis. The gambit goes from total apathy to total desperation and panic. One recent headline reads, "Climate Change could leave billions homeless." Whether or not you are pro-global warming or anti-global warming it does seem to occupy much of the current political dialogue.

There is also a "climate change" issue within the church. The issue for us is not "warming" but rather "cooling". The great concern that we face in the church is that of a spiritually cooling. I have observed that there has been a lowering of the spiritual temperature in the church today. The fire that was observed in the past, for some, is only a memory.

The need is for those of us in the church to get closer to God through the Holy Spirit. The fact is we get "hotter" the closer we get to the fire. Hebrews 12:28 tells us, "...our God is a consuming fire." We need a close encounter with the God of Pentecost. On the day of Pentecost the fire of the Holy Spirit fell upon the church and transformed it into a force to be reckoned with. The early church had hearts burning for the Lord and they turned the world upside down for Jesus (i.e. right side up - Acts 17:6). Unfortunately the church of today often seems to be turned upside down by the world. Why is that? Where are the burning hearted people of today? How can we get aflame for the Lord? How can we be re-fired? What do we do to have our hearts burn for the Lord?

We have been talking about "climate change" on the Hawaii Pacific District for the past ten months. Our purpose has been to facilitate a change of climate in our churches and around the district. This has led to the development of our district mission statement - "Equipping Churches for Health". But just talking about changing the climate is not enough. Developing a district mission statement is not enough. Taking church health surveys is not enough. Nothing will substitute for the fire of Pentecost falling anew upon each of our churches.

Vance Havner, a past Senate chaplain, once said, "We are not going to move this world by criticism of it, nor conformity to it, but only by the combustion within it of lives ignited by the Spirit of God."

He's right about that. What we need is more burning hearts, hearts aflame for Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit! With Pentecost Sunday upon us (May 27th), let's determine to experience anew the fire of Pentecost falling upon each of our churches. Let's begin to earnestly pray for the Lord to, "Do it again!" in each of our hearts and in each of our churches.
