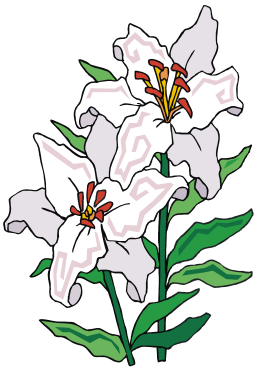

WITH SYMPATHY



On April 4, 2008, **Dr. Samuel Chiang** passed away. His service was conducted at Honolulu First Church on April 22.

On May 19, 2008, **Bernie Chiang** passed away—she was in the hospital at the time. MEMORIAL SERVICE will be at Honolulu First Church—Tuesday, May 27, 2008 at 7pm.

The Chiangs served God in Hawaii for many years—pastor of the Kahului Church of the Nazarene (1971-1976), Kaimuki Church of the Nazarene (1977-2000), Salvation Army Kauluwela Mission Japanese Section (1989-2008)

“Back to Basics – Discovering Our DNA: Prayer, Evangelism, Discipleship and Church Multiplication”. This was the theme of our recent District Assembly. These four initiatives are foundational elements that should “encode” each of our local churches!

Prayer –Too often we are guilty of attempting to do “church things” without adequate prayer-preparation. Jesus spoke to His disciples in Matthew 9:37-38 (NIV), “The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.” Neil Cole, says, “There is no substitute for going out among the lost people, looking deep into their eyes, and begging God for their souls. Of course, the Lord of the harvest longs to answer these prayers. He bled so that these souls could be saved.”

Evangelism - The emphasis on prayer naturally leads us to evangelism. If we are carrying a burden for the lost in prayer we will look for ways to bring the gospel message to them. Too many times we excuse ourselves from any evangelistic effort by pointing out that we are not “gifted” in evangelism. But we are all called to be witnesses of God's grace in our own lives. We are called to be “salt and light” in our world. We should all seek to represent Christ, indeed to be Christ, to the world. The method of evangelism is not as important as the fact that we are attempting to reach our world with the message of hope through Jesus Christ.

Discipleship – We know that our Lord has called us to be His disciples, but He has also called us to “make disciples”. If we are to be a healthy church we must do a better job of discipleship, becoming Christlike disciples and becoming intentional disciplers - training others in what it means to follow Christ. Dr. D. Michael Henderson, in One Conversation at a Time, states, “The command to make disciples is the central task of the entire church. There are many other things churches may do, but this is the one thing they must do.”

Church Multiplication – If we are being desperate in prayer and carrying a burden for the lost (evangelism) and being faithful to Christ's command to disciple believers, the natural result is church multiplication. The book of Acts records that “the number of the disciples multiplied greatly” and that “churches throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria... were multiplied” (Acts 6:7; 9:31). Church multiplication is biblical; it is part of the spiritual DNA of the church.

As we move “back to basics”, we will discover our DNA in our emphasis on these elements of prayer, evangelism, discipleship and church multiplication. These four initiatives must be encoded in the DNA of each of our local churches. This will assist us in becoming all that God desires us to be in our personal walk and in our churches.
